


Gaillardia ‘Oranges and Lemons’

Key Features

- ✓ Masses of soft orange and lemon yellow single blooms.
- ✓ Exceptionally long flowering period.
- ✓ Great landscape color to work with in the commercial landscape.

Characteristics

Genus & Species:	Gaillardia x <i>grandiflora</i>	
Protection Status:	PP 17,092; COFP Open.	
USDA Zone:	USDA Zone 5-9. (-20°F or -28°C).	
Bloom:	Masses of soft orange and lemon yellow single blooms.	
Bloom Time:	Early summers – fall.	
Foliage:	Medium green foliage.	
Habit:	Compact mounding habit 24” x 18”	
Propagation:	Softwood cuttings / Tissue Culture. <i>License required for propagation.</i>	
Culture:	Full sun, well-drained soil.	
Additional Comments:	Drought tolerant once established. Test result show great heat and humidity tolerance.	
Uses:	Beds, borders, mass Landscape.	

Approximate Finishing Time

- 4.5” - Quarts: 6-8 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
6” - Gallons: 10-12 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).

Closest Variety: G. ‘Goblin’

- Key Differences:**
- ✓ ‘Oranges and Lemons’ soft orange lemon blooms **vs.** bright blooms.
 - ✓ ‘Oranges and Lemons’ medium-tall habit **vs.** small-medium habit.
 - ✓ ‘Oranges and Lemons’ long flowering period **vs.** short-medium.
